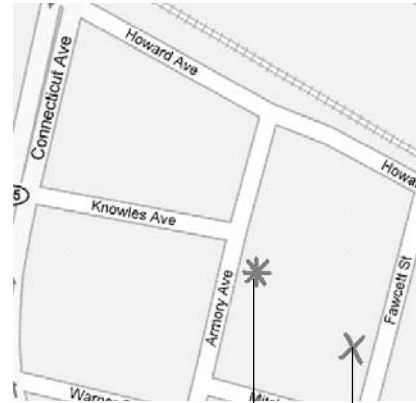

Renovation of Rock Creek Hills Triangles

The Board approved a request to improve the triangle at Haverhill Drive and Littledale Drive. The triangle cost the Association approximately \$1900.

The triangle improvement requests should be made to Shannon Hamm and consist of at least 3 landscaper bids. The Board will review each bid and present them to the Association for a vote at the next upcoming meeting. In considering whether to propose a renovation, the Board expects the residents near the triangle to provide maintenance by weeding the triangle. The Board will support maintenance of mulching, new plants, etc on a 3-5 year basis, but not to exceed \$500.

The Board will prioritize requests for renovations both by the order of their requests as well as the commitment from nearby residents on continued upkeep for the triangles. This is consistent with how the request for renovation on Haverhill and Littledale is being handled. Each new request for

another triangle renovation will be presented to the Association for a vote. To send in new requests, please contact Shannon Hamm at shannon@hammonline.net.

There are seven (7) triangles in our boundaries. The triangles include:

- McNeely triangle at Saul and Elrod
- Saul and Haverhill
- Haverhill and Littledale
(1st in renovation queue)
- East Bexhill and Hawick Ct
- Elrod and Hawick Ct
- Elrod and Old Spring
- Kent and East Bexhill

The Board understands the importance of improving these amenities, and would like the support of the citizens' association.

Two Rock Creek Hills Parks?

Most residents of Rock Creek Hills are familiar with the Rock Creek Hills Park located at the intersection of Saul Road and Haverhill Drive. Rock Creek Hills Park is actually comprised of “two parcels - the recreation opportunities are located at the parcel on Saul Road. The second parcel is located between the Capital Beltway and Campbell Drive and is undeveloped woodland.” http://www.mc-mncppc.org/parks/park_of_the_day/apr/parkday_apr25.shtm

The park property between the Beltway and Campbell Drive is about ½ the size of the park at the intersection of Saul Road and Haverhill Drive. This parkland slopes down from Campbell Drive to the Beltway.

At the May RCHCA meeting, the Board proposes a discussion of potential recreational uses of this parkland to enhance the neighborhood

Traffic Calming Status Update

As this process continues, the County provided a speed hump location plan, and Official Resident Speed Hump Concurrence Forms for traffic calming on Saul Road on the day of the deadline for submissions to the newsletter. These will be presented to the residences identified by the County.

We hope to receive the speed hump location plan, and Official Resident Speed Hump Concurrence Forms for traffic calming on Kensington Parkway prior to the meeting on May 9th.

Neighborhood Road Condition after Resurfacing

A number of residents have complained about the condition of the road surfaces in the neighborhood following the resurfacing. The streets that were resurfaced in Rock Creek Hills were resurfaced in a two step process.

The first step involves spraying a layer of liquid asphalt (tar) on the road surface, then immediately spreading a layer of stone chips (aggregate) over it, using a special machine. The surface is then rolled to press the aggregate into the liquid asphalt. The Department of Public Works and Transportation (DPWT) web site calls this process “chip seal”.

The second step is an application of a thin asphalt overlay/sealer that will fill in slight imperfections and give the street a uniform color and texture. Most importantly it seals the street, thus preventing the infiltration of water, which is the most frequent cause of pavement failure. There is a residue (sandy grit) that remains loose on the finished surface, but it dissipates in a short time. The Department of Public Works and Transportation (DPWT) web site calls this process “micro seal”.

Several County resources and letters from County officials indicate that following the “chip seal” and “micro seal” process the new surface will be coarser than the previous surface, but will gradually become smoother under traffic.

The County uses the “chip seal” and “micro seal” process to resurface streets instead of using a hot mix asphalt to reduce the cost of road maintenance. Hot mix asphalt will generally provide a smooth surface, but is estimated to cost six times as much as the “chip seal” and “micro seal” process.

The Board would like to discuss what steps, if any, Rock Creek Hills Citizens Association should take to address the conditions of the neighborhood streets following the resurfacing.

Train Noise Update

The bureaucratic logjam appears to be slowly lifting. To refresh: A request was made last October by the State Highway Administration (SHA) to CSX Transportation requesting the latter's cooperation and use of its right of way to install and utilize a Wayside Horn. Although not a Quiet Zone, this cost-effective, compromise solution, which SHA offered to fund, is based on a site-mounted horn that affects a much smaller area than train mounted horns. The Wayside Horn also is required to be blown at a lower decibel level than train-mounted horns.

After 6 months of no response from CSX, a phone call was made by your President to SHA, informing them that a letter writing campaign would recommence to get public officials involved once again if this initiative were to languish indefinitely. We were finally informed that CSX has agreed in principal to cooperate with the proposed solution, although some issues remain to be worked out. Vigilance will be employed to see this effort through to fruition.

Covenants Update

In our continuing efforts to better inform residents about our covenants, these are some of the key Do's and Don'ts. Please feel free to contact Vince De Cain, Chair of the Covenants committee with questions, or Shannon Reid Hamm. Vince's number is (301) 946-5129.

Do's:

1. Know your covenants – if you need a copy call Vince or Shannon. Look in your Rock Creek Hills Directory for the main ones.
2. Before you plan any outside construction projects, contact your neighbors to discuss. This includes fences.
3. All fences must have permits and have approval by the Rock Creek Hills Executive Board.
4. Know your property lines. Get a survey.
5. Be courteous to your neighbors when speaking to them and when construction noise may be of concern. Talk with your neighbors during construction to see if there are any concerns.

Don'ts:

1. Don't wait until the last minute to talk to your neighbor about a major construction project.
2. Chain link fences are prohibited. Wrought Iron fences are not approved. The Covenants Inc. will enforce this policy.
3. Don't assume you know your property line.
4. Don't wait until the last minute to present your plans to the Rock Creek Hills Executive Committee. While we do try to be timely, all of us hold jobs and are subject to other emergencies. Minimum time for approval is 2 weeks.
